IOWA CITY, Iowa — Seven of the Republican presidential candidates swarmed the campaign trail in Iowa over the weekend, with most competing for the title of "Toughest on Hamas."

The candidates who spoke Friday at a fundraiser for U.S. Rep. Mariannette Miller-Meeks, R-Iowa, uniformly blamed President Joe Biden for the violence in Israel and many also called for retaliation against college students who demonstrate in favor of Palestine. Vivek Ramaswamy was the only candidate to express discomfort with the idea of an Israeli ground invasion in the Gaza Strip. | Lowa Capital Dispatch

CEDAR RAPIDS — Republican presidential candidate Nikki Haley said Friday that when she talked to Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu on the recent conflict with Hamas, she had one thing to tell him: "Finish them."

Haley has emphasized her national security credentials on the campaign trail as a 2024 presidential candidate, speaking extensively on the need to combat China. In the wake of Hamas attacks on Israel, Haley told a crowd in Cedar Rapids Friday that the U.S. needs to pursue three goals when it comes to the Middle Eastern conflict. | <u>Iowa Capital Dispatch</u>


