While experts say that Iowa often breaks late, some experts are questioning whether there's enough time for other Republican presidential candidates to jump ahead of former President Donald Trump.

- Kansas political scientist, Bob Beatty, a professor of political science at Washburn University in Topeka, <u>told the Kansas Reflector</u> that because the Republican field remains splintered, Trump has the option of concentrating on a rematch with President Joe Biden.
- Political analyst Charlie Cook, founder of the Cook Political Report, <u>said at an Iowa event</u> that he believes the 2024 presidential election will be a Trump-Biden rematch but that both parties would be better off nominating a different candidate.
- Still, influential conservatives who want a Trump alternative on the ballot are putting their support behind other candidates. Reporters and political commentators on a "Meet the Press" panel said Florida Gov. Ron DeSantis' important Iowa endorsers may help him, but that anything less than an Iowa win could mean the end of his campaign.


