Following an <u>overwhelming victory</u> in the 2024 Republican Iowa caucuses last week, former President Donald Trump's campaign is aiming for a decisive win in the New Hampshire primary Tuesday to end the race for the GOP presidential nomination early.

- Former U.N. Ambassador Nikki Haley is also looking for a New Hampshire win. She hopes the primary results will show there's a path to victory while challenging Trump for the nomination. New Hampshire polls show her behind Trump but gaining traction with Republican primary voters.
- The New Hampshire campaign trail looks different this year, with fewer direct voter interactions with candidates and pointed questions than other nomination cycles. Experts say this may be because there are two separate electorates voting for their presidential nominee of choice Tuesday those locked in to vote for Donald Trump and those still interested in exploring their options.
- Secretary of State Dave Scanlan is <u>predicting Republican voter participation</u> will outnumber that of Democrats by more than 230,000 in the Tuesday primary, and will far outpace the former 2016 record of 287,652 votes cast in the GOP primary.

<u>Florida's DeSantis withdraws from Republican</u> <u>presidential race, endorses Trump</u>

Florida Gov. Ron DeSantis, who came in second in the first-in-the-nation Iowa Caucuses on Jan. 15, released a nearly five-minute video on social media Sunday announcing that he had suspended his campaign and was endorsing the front-runner, former President Donald Trump.

"Following our second-place finish in Iowa, we've prayed and deliberated on the way forward," DeSantis said. "If there was anything I could do to produce a favorable outcome, more campaign stops, more interviews, I would do it. But I can't ask our supporters to volunteer their time and donate their resources. We don't have a clear path to victory." | News from the States

'We're all in this together': Issues unite voters, candidates divide them

Though New Hampshire voters expressed support for different presidential candidates, many said the need for a more compassionate, democratic America was one of the main three issues motivating them to vote in 2024, along with illegal immigration and the economy.

That's in line with results released Friday by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center, which showed that 66 percent of respondents said the southern border/immigration were a top concern in choosing a candidate, followed by the cost of living (39 percent), protecting democracy (38 percent), and the economy (29 percent). | New Hampshire Bulletin


