Former President Donald Trump and President Joe Biden have long focused on one another on the campaign trail as presumptive party nominees, and results from Super Tuesday nominating contests have left them both with clear leads as focus shifts to the November general election.

- While Trump <u>netted the lion's share of delegates</u>, Republican challenger Nikki Haley pulled her second upset in recent days in <u>Vermont</u>.
- Haley <u>ended her presidential campaign</u> the following day, ending her increasingly longshot bid of besting Trump without endorsing him.
- Biden also extended his winning streak on Super Tuesday, including in <u>Iowa</u>, which announced the results of Democrats' first mail-in presidential preference contest.

Following the contests, Biden <u>delivered a fiery State of the Union address Thursday</u>, where he portrayed himself as a defender of democracy and criticized Trump for his comments on Ukraine's war against Russian invasion.

Biden returned to Pennsylvania on Friday for his fourth visit of the year and his first campaign event after his State of the Union address. The president underlined the stakes of the upcoming election and largely echoed the message he had shared with the nation the night before, setting the stage for the likely rematch in November with Trump.

The president said that Trump wants to pass a national abortion ban. If reelected and if Democrats win the majority in Congress, Biden said he would make Roe v Wade "the law of the land again." | Pennsylvania Capital-Star

## Trump, Biden hold competing rallies in Georgia ahead of Tuesday's primary contests

Biden and Trump, separated by less than 100 miles in Georgia, took turns attacking each other in front of friendly crowds Saturday as voting wraps up Tuesday in the battleground state.

The presence of both presidential front-runners in Georgia at the same time was a nod to the decisive role Georgia will play once again in determining who leads the nation. While the dueling visits came before Georgians cast their ballots for the state's presidential primary Tuesday, Haley's exit from the race means there will not be much competition for either candidate on the path to the presidential nomination. | <u>Georgia Recorder</u>


